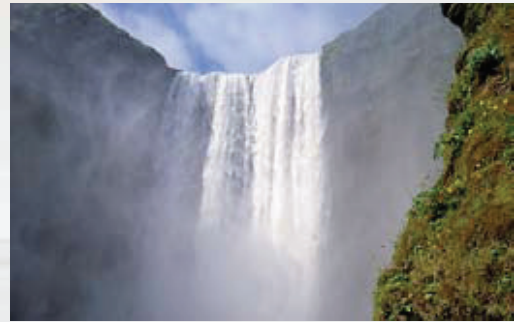
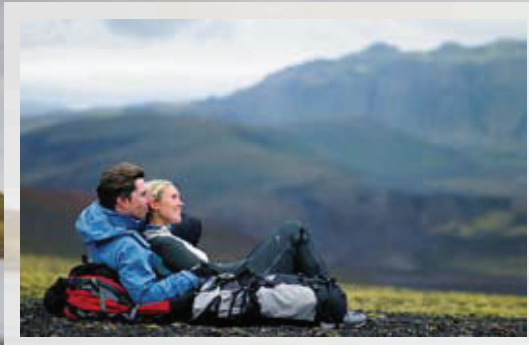

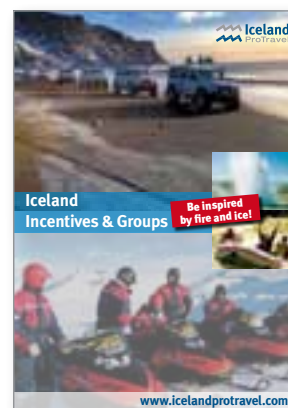

Information for your Holiday to Iceland

Iceland is a volcanic island, which originated only about 16 million years ago and is therefore one of Europe's youngest regions. The landscape is unique, with fjords, impressive waterfalls, bubbling geysers and gigantic glaciers as well as the wild and uninhabited highlands, partly resembling a moon landscape.

The country has a total area of 103,000 square km and is almost two-and-a-half times the size of Switzerland. With a coastline of 6000 km, Iceland extends 300 km from north to south and around 500 km from east to west. Iceland has around 300,000 inhabitants, of whom around 170,000 live in Reykjavik and its surroundings.

The Icelanders voted for the first democratically elected female head of state in 1980, Vigdis Finnbogadóttir. They are very open-minded and progressive and their standard of living is one of the highest in the world. On the other hand they place great importance in their myths and ancient "sagas". There is little difference between the Icelandic language of today and that spoken during the first settlement, but English is widely understood.

ARRIVAL

To enter Iceland from the United Kingdom, you need a valid passport, which must be valid for at least three months after your departure. Airline economy class baggage allowance is normally 20kg per person.

CURRENCY

The currency used in Iceland is the Icelandic Krone ("krona"), ISK. MasterCard and Visa credit cards are widely accepted. In larger towns and airports, it is easy to get cash from EC cash machines. Exchange rate in December 2009: 1 GBP = 202 ISK

TRAVEL CONNECTIONS

There are good bus connections to almost every point of the island. Reykjavik itself has an excellent bus service. There is no train service, but there is a domestic airline service between Reykjavik, Höfn, Egilsstaðir, Akureyri and the West Fjords. The international airport is in Keflavik, 50km west of Reykjavik.

MOBILE TELEPHONES

Most UK-registered mobile telephones can be used in Iceland provided International Roaming is enabled. Except in the highlands, the roaming service is good. Siminn and Vodafone GSM-telephone cards are also available at all fuel stations. These two providers cover the biggest part of the island as well as all municipalities of at least 200 inhabitants. At fuel stations, you can also rent NMT mobile telephones, which cover almost all of Iceland including the highlands.

OPENING HOURS

Banks are open from Monday to Friday between 9.15 and 16.00. Cash machines can be found in larger towns. In general, shops are open Monday to Friday from 9.00 to 18.00 and Saturdays from 10.00 to 14.00. Some souvenir shops are also open on Sundays. Tourist information in Reykjavik is open daily from 8.30 to 19.00 (01.06–15.09). Between 16.09 and 31.05, it is open on weekdays from 9.00 to 18.00 and at the weekend from 10.00 to 14.00.

CLIMATE

Although the warm Gulf Stream has a positive effect on the climate, you should be ready for all kinds of weather. In summer, temperatures generally vary between 12° and 15° Celsius, though they may climb as high as 20°C. Rain showers are always possible, but Reykjavik's average rainfall is less than that of London for example. Temperatures in winter are around +/- 5°C, and even though it can be very windy, it is not as cold as often assumed.

PECULIARITIES

By March, the days are longer in Iceland than in central Europe. The midnight sun can be observed especially well from mid-May to mid-July, during the clear nights in the north of the country. From September until March you can admire the northern lights, or Aurora Borealis, that can only be seen close to the polar regions. The days during the winter are not as dark as one may think and from November to February there are still five to eight hours of daylight.

EATING AND DRINKING IN ICELAND

The Icelandic specialities are tender lamb and fresh fish, which are prepared in many various and delicious ways. There are also numerous restaurants and fast-food outlets, serving Indian, French, Mexican and Italian snacks and main meals – the choice is yours. With each meal complimentary fresh water is served. Soft drinks, beer and a wide variety of wines are also available.

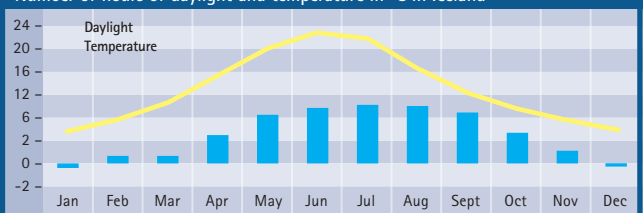

Fly & Drive







The road system in Iceland is extensive, but some roads are quite adventurous and can be tough-going. About 70% of the roads are surfaced, the Ring Road No. 1 among them. Some roads are gravelled or just simple tracks and potholes are to be expected. More care is required when using these roads. Roads with one- or two-digit numbers are no problem for normal cars. The tour across the highlands, where the roads have three-digit numbers, has to be planned differently since the highland area is uninhabited and services are not readily available. These highland routes can only be traversed in four-wheel-drive vehicles with high ground clearance.







PLEASE NOTE:







When you make a reservation, we can only confirm the category of your vehicle, not a specific make or model. The minimum age for vehicle rental is 25 years. Fuel (including canister refill) is not included in the rental prices. When you return the vehicle you should clean it properly, otherwise a cleaning fee of up to £80 will be charged.

For an additional fee we can arrange for you to pick up or drop off your vehicle at Keflavik Airport.

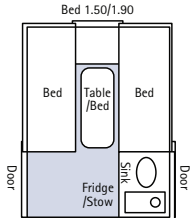
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- When picking up your car at the airport, please note that you must leave a copy of your credit card as security.
- Car categories: We are only able to confirm car category, not type of car, since more than one type of car can be in each category.
- Driving licence: You have to be at least 20 years of age, and have a minimum of one year's driving experience in order to rent a car in Iceland. If you plan to have more than one driver, a surcharge of £17 is applicable.



- The CDW insurance (excess of £612 for categories Z-N and £1,156 for categories F-I) covers all damage, with the following exceptions:
 - damage to the underside of the car.
 - damage caused by off-road driving, river-crossing or driving through lakes.
 - damage caused deliberately, or by gross negligence.
 - damage caused under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 - damage caused by sandstorms.
 - damage caused when driving passenger cars in the highlands.
- An airport fee of £17 will be charged when picking up the car at the airport in Keflavik

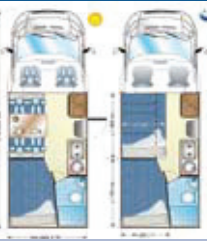

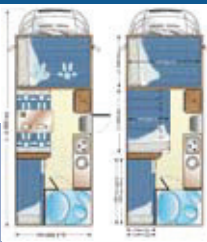

Along the South Coast

Five-day and Four-night Trip

This trip gives you the opportunity to discover the wonderful saga of Iceland and see the most beautiful surroundings in just five days. This is ideal for half-term breaks.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL

Flight to Reykjavík, and collection of your rental car at the airport. Drive to Hotel Selfoss, where accommodation is reserved for three nights.

DAY 2: THINGVELLIR, KERID, GULLFOSS-GEYSIR AND SKÁLHOLT

Drive up to Thingvellir, where the world's oldest parliament was set up in around 930 AD. Thingvellir is on the World Heritage List, first published by UNESCO in 1972. From there you drive to Kerid, which is thought to be around 3,000 years old. Continuing on to Gullfoss and Geysir, you'll have chance to visit one of the most remarkable tourist attractions in Iceland. On the way back you might want to stop at Skálholt. Skálholt was home to the head of the Icelandic Church from 1056 AD, which was located there for nearly 750 years.

DAY 3: SKEIÐARÁRSANDUR/JÖKULSURÁRLÓN

These unique surroundings have captured the attention of many filmmakers. Here, major parts of both James Bond and Batman movies were shot.

Active trip on Vatnajökull, the biggest glacier in Europe. The trip takes about five hours and is suitable for everyone. You will be driven almost 9km up onto the glacier, where the view is simply stunning.

DAY 4: DRIVE TO REYKJAVÍK.

Staying overnight at the Hotel Viking. A free day to get to know the capital, with an optional visit to the Blue Lagoon.

DAY 5

Head home.

PROFILE: This tour is for those who want to travel around Iceland on a budget, but still with time to experience it all. In addition to the route along the Snæfellsnes peninsula in the west, the route leads into the majestic fjords of the east. Accommodation is booked in various types of hotels/guesthouses along the ring road. Whether in lovingly renovated former farmhouses or comfortable new buildings in a cosy, sophisticated atmosphere, you can count on friendly and helpful service. Personal towels are not provided. Linen can be hired on arrival. Distance driven: about 2,400km in total.

PROFILE: Explore the ring road, where you can see the main sights of the island in the shortest time. You will stay in youth hostels/guesthouses around the country. Whether lovingly renovated former farmhouses or comfortable new buildings in a cosy, sophisticated atmosphere, you can count on friendly and helpful service. Towels are not provided. Sleeping bags may be bought or borrowed on the spot. Distance driven: about 1,800km in total.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL

Flights to Iceland and collection of the rental car at the airport. Drive to southwest Iceland overnight.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL

Southwest Keflavik, Iceland. Collection of the rental car and drive to accommodation in south-west Iceland.

DAYS 2 TO 14: THE RING ROAD

The ring road. Explore the vibrant Reykjavik, the varied Snæfellsnes Peninsula and on the way to the colourful area of Lake Myvatn, the metropolis of the north, Akureyri. Other highlights include the Dettifoss waterfall, and a whale-watching cruise in the fishing village of Husavik. In the south, awaiting for you are geysers, the Gullfoss waterfall and the Thingvellir National Park.

DAYS 2 TO 7: CIRCUMNAVIGATION OF THE ISLAND

Discover the natural beauty of Iceland, such as the Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss waterfalls on the south coast, as well as the Geysir and the Gullfoss waterfalls. A must is a visit to the Glacier Lagoon Jökulsárlon at Skaftafell National Park in the north and the area around Lake Myvatn. In the west, Lava Hraunfossar waterfalls are worth seeing. The visit to the unique Blue Lagoon is another option on the programme. The lively capital of Reykjavik offers many attractions, such as shopping and museums.

Drive to Keflavik International Airport, return the rental car and fly home.

Along the Ring Road

From the fishing village Höfn you drive to the Eastern Fjords, which belong geologically to the oldest parts of Iceland.

DAY 5: EGILSSTAÐIR – MYVATN

A visit to Petra's "rock garden" is not to be missed. From Egilsstaðir you drive through the uninhabited and desert-like areas of the Modrudalsoraefi. Explore the area around Myvatn, an active volcanic zone with pseudo-craters, sulphuric springs and bizarre lava formations as well as lush green fertile plains. This area is also home to a large variety of birdlife.

DAY 6: AKUREYRI – SKAGAFJORD

Visit Godafoss, the impressive "waterfall of the Gods" en route to Akureyri, the largest town in the north. Take a trip to the fishing village Husavik, where you can join a whale-watching excursion in a wooden boat. Overnight stay is in Skagafjord, an area well known for the breeding of Icelandic horses.

DAY 7: SKAGAFJORD – BORGAFJORD – REYKJAVÍK

Close to Saudakrokur lies the fascinating folk museum at Glaumbaer. Continue west to the Borgarfjord district with its lava waterfalls and hot-water springs. Return to Reykjavik, where the tour ends.

DAY 6: MYVATN – EGILSSTADIR – EASTERN FJORDS

You cross the Modrudalur desert to Egilsstadir, the commercial centre of the east. The route leads you further into the Eastern Fjords, to Stodvarfjord, set amongst dramatic ice-sculpted mountains. Visit Petra's unique rock collection as well as the fishing village of Djupivogur.

DAY 7: EASTERN FJORDS – GLACIER LAGOON – SKAFTAFELL

You continue on to the peak of Almannaskard, with views (in good weather) of the giant glacier Vatnajökull. Passing the fishing village of Höfn, you reach the glacier lagoon Jokulsarlon, where it is worth taking an exhilarating boat trip among drifting icebergs.

DAY 8: SKAFTAFELL – SKOGAR

In Skaftafell National Park, you will find the beautiful Svartifoss waterfall surrounded by basalt columns. Through the sand desert Skeidarasandur and the lava field, Eldhraun you reach the village of Kirkjubaejarklaustur. Continue through lava and black sand to the Vik village in Myrdalur. Plenty of sea birds nest at Cape Dyrholaey, among them the puffins, providing a favourite photo opportunity.

DAY 9: SKOGAR – GULLFOSS – GEYSIR

Today's first destinations are the two waterfalls Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss. Continue the drive to two more famous sights: the Gullfoss waterfall, which spans several levels, and the Geysir area where Strokkur "the butter churn" is constantly active.

DAY 10: THINGVELLIR – REYKJAVÍK

From the 'greenhouse town' of Hvergerdi you drive through the geologically and historically interesting Thingvellir National Park. A hike through the "All-men-gorge" and the Althing, the parliamentary seat, will be a fitting end to your tour before returning to Reykjavik.

Iceland's past and present – 9 days

A compact itinerary, visiting places of historical interest and natural beauty. We visit country museums, giving an insight into Icelandic life in a bygone era. We travel around Snæfellsnes, with its glacier and interesting fishing towns, visit the fjord-side town of Akureyri and Lake Myvatn, rich in bird life and flora. We travel across the uninhabited highlands to the south and visit Skaftafell National Park, nestling below Iceland's highest mountain and the mighty Vatnajökull icecap. Accommodation is provided in hotels with private facilities. The hotels are often "summer hotels", used most of the year as boarding schools or country hotels, and are simple and clean. On some departures, this tour may be operated in reverse.

DAY 1: ARRIVAL

Flight from the UK to Iceland. Flybus transfer from Keflavik airport to your accommodation in Reykjavik.

DAY 2: REYKJAVÍK–BORGARFJÖRDUR

A short drive brings us to Thingvellir National Park, site of the old Viking parliament. Then it's on to Borgarfjörður, where we visit the beautiful waterfalls of Hraunfossar, where water comes from under the lava and runs into the river Hvítá. After this, we journey to Deildartunguhver, one of the biggest hot springs in Europe. Accommodation for the next two nights is in the Borgarfjörður area.

DAY 3: SNÆFELLSNES

We drive around the Snæfellsnes glacier and enjoy the magnificent coastal and mountain scenery. We then visit the former fishing centre of Dritvík, the turf house museum at Hellisandur and shark-processing farm at Bjarnarhöfn.

DAY 4: BORGARFJÖRDUR–EYJAFJÖRDUR

Journey along Laxárdalur, the setting of one of Iceland's famous Sagas, where we visit the replica farmhouse of Erik the Red. Continue past the trading town of Blönduós to Skagafjörður, where we will be introduced to the Icelandic horses. We travel over the Öxnadalur mountain pass to Akureyri, the main town of northern Iceland. We will stay for the next two nights in the Eyjafjörður area.

DAY 5: DAY AT LAKE MYVATN

A day excursion to Lake Myvatn, considered one of the most fertile areas in the world so close to the Arctic Circle. A stop will be made en route at one of Iceland's most majestic waterfalls, Godafoss, where Thorgeir threw his pagan idols into the falls when accepting Christianity in the year 1000 AD. Close to Myvatn, we visit the recent lava flows from the Krafla volcano, the hot springs at Námaskard and the magnificent lava landscape of Dimmuborgir.

DAY 6: EYJAFJÖRDUR–THE SOUTH

We start the day with a visit to the farm museum at Glaumbær. Then we cross the highlands on the Kjölur route, between the ice caps of Langjökull and Hofsjökull, to the hot springs at Hveravellir. We stop by the Gullfoss waterfall, and Iceland's most famous hot spring, Geysir. We then continue on to our accommodation in the south of Iceland, where we stay for two nights.

DAY 7: SOUTH COAST AND SKAFTAFELL NATIONAL PARK

We travel along the south coast, where Iceland's largest ice cap, Vatnajökull, dominates the landscape, and then visit the National Park nestling below Iceland's highest mountain, 2110m Hvannadalshnjúkur. We also visit two more of Iceland's magnificent waterfalls on this full-day excursion.

DAY 8: THE SOUTH–REYKJAVÍK

Our first stop is at Skálholt church, rich in history and legend. Continue on to the coastal towns of Stokkseyri and Eyrarbakki, formerly the main harbour and trading centres of south Iceland. In Eyrarbakki, we visit the old museum buildings. Our last stop before returning to the capital is at the greenhouse town of Hveragerdi.

DAY 9: DEPARTURE

After breakfast (depending on flights), you can enjoy some time in Reykjavik, before you take the Flybus from your hotel to the airport. Flight back to the UK.

The best-known of all treks in Iceland, this trail leads from the famous valley of Landmannalaugar in the southern highlands, south to Thórsmörk valley north of the great Eyjafjallajökull glacier. On the way, we cross the third-biggest geothermal zone in the world, pass yellow rhyolite mountains, black deserts, great canyons and green valleys. Accommodation is in comfortable mountain huts.

Arrival at Hrafninnusker mountain hut, where we will stay the night, in the late afternoon. **Distance:** 12km (7.5miles), **Walking time:** 4-5 hrs, **Ascent:** 470m (1540').

DAY 2

From Hrafninnusker, we descend down the gullies of Jökultungur with hundreds of steaming hot springs and mud pools. There we enjoy fascinating views to the south to the Álfvatn area (Swan Lake), and the Mýrdalsjökull and Eyjafjallajökull glaciers. In the afternoon we arrive at Álfvatn hut, where we stay the night. **Distance:** 12km (7.5 miles), **Walking time:** 4-5 hrs, **Descent:** 490m (1610').

DAY 3

We pass the foot of the green conic volcano of Stórasúla before entering the black deserts of Mælifellssandur. Heading towards another ancient and verdurous volcano, the Hattfell, we enter the Emstrur region, where farmers used to graze their sheep in summer. Before arriving at the Botnar hut where we stay the night, we visit the magnificent Markarfljót canyon. **Distance:** 15km (9.5 miles), **Walking time:** 6-7 hrs, **Descent:** 40m (130').

DAY 4

We continue up and down through the small valleys and gullies of Emstrur, where the great Mýrdalsjökull glacier rises only a couple of kilometres away. At the end of the day the vegetation starts to grow thicker and higher as we descend in to Thórsmörk's (the woods of Thor) green valleys filled with arctic birch forests and colourful flowers. Night in one of the huts in Thórsmörk. **Distance:** 15km (9.5 miles), **Walking time:** 6-7 hrs, **Descent:** 300m (985').

DAY 5

We spend the morning in Thórsmörk, where we walk along one of numerous paths before taking the afternoon bus to Reykjavik. Arrival at Reykjavik Central bus station at 19:00, where the trip ends.

Craters, Canyons and Lava – 7 days

A trek in Iceland's greatest volcanic region

This highly volcanic area has known several eruptions since the settlement of Iceland. In this wilderness just south-west of the great Vatnajökull glacier, we walk amongst the volcanic formations of the Eldhraun along rivers and past beautiful lakes that give this lunar landscape a special aura. This is a lightweight trek over rather easy terrain. Accommodation in comfortable mountain huts.

DAY 1

Pick-up in Reykjavik around 7:15. On the way we stop briefly at Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls, where we have a picnic lunch. In the afternoon we'll go for a walk around Kirkjubæjarklaustur before dinner at the hotel. **Distance:** 5km (3miles), **Walking time:** 1-2 hrs.

DAY 2

Departure at 8:30. On the way we'll see the beautiful Fjarðarargljúfur canyon and visit the impressive Fagrifoss waterfall. We arrive at Laki mountain at noon. We then drive to Tjarnargigur. From there we hike south to the charming Hrossatungur hut. This is where we spend the next two nights. **Distance:** 10-12km (6-7 miles), **Walking time:** 4-5 hrs.

DAY 3

We are driven to the Varmá river. We then hike across several small spring rivers before we arrive at the great Skaftá river. We follow the river to the north, to the blue lakes of Lyngfellsiggar before climbing up the Kambur ridge over to the lakes Kambavatn and Lambavatn. At Lambavatn our vehicle awaits to take us back to our hut. **Distance:** 15-20km (9-12 miles), **Walking time:** 6-8 hrs.

DAY 4

Exploration of the seemingly endless lava that flowed from the 25km-long Laki fissure. We then follow the edge of this impressive lava field towards the friendly Blágil hut, where we stay the night. **Distance:** 12-15km (7-9miles), **Walking time:** 5-7 hrs.

DAY 5

The day starts with the crossing of the Hellisá river before mounting the hills of Bárðarhnúkar. We arrive at the lone crater of Rauðhóll before descending into the eastern part of the Eldhraun "fire"-lava. From there, we head towards the shepherd's hut at Miklafell. **Distance:** 15-20km (9-12 miles), **Walking time:** 6-8 hrs.

DAY 6

From Miklafell, there is an easy walk east to the great Hverfisfljót river. We walk along this great body of water down to the lava field, where a vehicle awaits to bring us back to the hotel. **Distance:** 12-15km (7-9 miles), **Walking time:** 5-7 hrs.

DAY 7

Departure from our hotel at 8:30 to catch the bus to Reykjavik. The mountain bus will take us west to the famous Eldgjá volcano (one-hour stop), where we hike to the beautiful Ófærufoss waterfall. Arrive in Reykjavik at around 19:00.

After a good breakfast we drive further east to Skaftafell National Park. Skaftafell is a wooded area surrounded by expanses of sand desert deposited by glacial rivers and a massive glacier named Vatnajökull. Here we have the opportunity to go on an easy glacier walk and search for ice caves. From Skaftafell, we continue to the famous glacier lagoon Jökulsárlón with its floating icebergs calving from majestic glacier Vatnajökull. We return to our cosy farm Hrífunes, where we relax and enjoy another great dinner prepared by



Hadda.

DAY 4: SOUTH COAST

We leave the beautiful Hrífunes farm behind and head through south Iceland back to Reykjavik. On our way, we stop at the varied sights along the south coast, like the basalt formations of Reynisdrangar and the beautiful waterfalls Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss. The tour finishes in Reykjavik with a convivial evening at the home of Haukur and Hadda, with the opportunity to relax in the hot tub in their garden.

All information provided in this brochure and on the web pages www.icelandprotravel.com and www.icelandprotravel.co.uk is, to the best of our knowledge and belief, correct at the time of publication. We will advise you of any changes that are fundamental to the contract or that we believe will affect your enjoyment of the holiday. Please advise us if there is any facility which you believe is fundamental to your holiday so that we can give you the latest information at time of booking.

1. Booking

When you make your booking request, we require you to pay us a deposit and confirm your request in writing. This should be by email, fax or letter. The person who makes the booking accepts responsibility for the whole party, and in particular for payment for all persons travelling. You must be at least 18 years old to make a booking. We will confirm your booking with a written confirmation/invoice. It is our intention to send a written confirmation of your reservation within 48 hours, stating which services are to be included and the price of your holiday. This applies to both individual bookings and organised tours. We require a deposit of 100% per person to confirm a reservation. Having received full payment, we will dispatch your travel documents and vouchers. In the case of bookings made less than eight weeks before departure, full payment is required at the time of booking. If we cannot accept the booking due to non-availability of services, any money paid to Iceland ProTravel Ltd. will be promptly refunded.

2. Payment

We hold your deposit towards the full cost of the holiday. The balance must be received by us no later than eight weeks prior to departure. If you do not pay the full cost within the time specified, we reserve the right to cancel all arrangements made on your behalf and retain any monies previously paid.

2.a. Payment methods

We accept Visa, Mastercard, bank debit card or cheque. Credit-card transactions will incur an additional charge of 2% of the transaction cost.

3. Surcharges

We reserve the right to notify you of any increase in advertised prices before accepting your booking. After a confirmation and invoice have been issued, the price of your holiday is subject to change due to currency variations of more than 2%. Should this lead to an increase in the cost of your holiday, we will absorb any increase up to 2% of the holiday price, excluding insurance premiums, and any amendment charges. 4.b. Cancellation by us

In such instances we will promptly refund all monies paid.

5. Variation by the customer
