





The awe-inspiring landscapes, the pristine forces of nature, the infinite and always surprising combinations of earth, water, fire and air are everywhere.





The West

Fifty-five miles (90 km) long, the spectacular Snaefellsnes Peninsula is often called "Iceland in Miniature" because it boasts many different landscapes from dramatic fjords, snowcapped mountains and sandy beaches to fishing villages, historical sites and waterfalls. Even by Icelandic standards, the region's wilderness areas are incredibly pristine. The deep, narrow fjords are also an excellent place to fish for cod, halibut, catfish, haddock, saithe and redfish.

The South

Some of the best known Icelandic sights are in this area including the Strokkur geyser, the geologically and historically interesting Thingvellir area and the imposing Gullfoss waterfall. Also located here is the famous Eyjafjallajokull glacier, which covers the caldera of an ancient volcano. Vestmannaeyjar are a group of 14 volcanic islands, only one of which is inhabited – Heimaey. Several spectacular waterfalls and dramatic sea cliffs are also found along the south shore.



The North

Nowhere else in the world do so many whales gather in one area as in the waters off northern Iceland. Observing whales in the wild is always a thrilling adventure. Also located in the north is the fascinating Lake Myvatn region. The schizophrenic landscape looks as if "heaven and hell" have clashed. One side of the lake features rugged volcanic remnants, while the other side is blessed with lush vegetation and varied bird life.



The East

The eastern coast of Iceland is dominated by narrow fjords, rugged mountains, remote homesteads and historic fishing villages. Here you find a variety of hiking trails that lead through untouched nature and spectacular scenery. Among the region's highlights are the town of Djupivogur on the Berufjordur fjord and Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon, full of icebergs from Breidamerkurjokull glacier.

DAY 1 | REYKJAVIK

Use your leisure time in Reykjavik to discover the unique charm of the world's northernmost capital. The OCEAN DIAMOND docks in Old Reykjavik Harbor in the heart of the city, a five-minute stroll from the main squares, shopping and dining. The ship departs in the evening.

DAY 2 | STYKKISHOLMUR

Stykkisholmur is the starting point of our adventures on the Snaefellsnes Peninsula. Often called "Iceland in Miniature" because of its diverse landscapes, the area is home to bird-rich Breidafjordur Bay and Snaefellsjokull glacier. This glacier sits atop of a 700,000-year-old dormant volcano that was featured in the Jules Verne novel *Journey to the Center of the Earth.*

DAY 3 | ISAFJORDUR

Today's destination is Isafjordur, an idyllic town in the Westfjords region. This secluded peninsula is connected to the Icelandic mainland by only a narrow strip of land and includes many roadless areas where cars have never been. The landscape includes jaw-dropping views of dramatic fjords carved by ancient glaciers, sheer table mountains that plunge into the sea and pristine North Atlantic vegetation.

DAY 4 | SIGLUFJORDUR / HRISEY

By morning we reach the fjord town of Siglufjordur, once the hub of the global herring industry and now enjoying a rebirth in popularity. Learn about the golden age of herring at the award-winning Herring Era Museum located on the vibrant harbor-front. In the early afternoon we head to Hrisey, the second largest island of Iceland. With only 153 inhabitants, the island is located in Eyjafjordur, about 22 miles (35 km) north of Akureyri.


DAY 5 | FLATEY / HUSAVIK

In the morning we visit Flatey Island. It's a natural haven for birdlife and home to the arctic tern and puffins, which can be observed at close quarters. Around lunch time we steam further into the Skjalfandi Bay and visit Husavik.

DAY 6 | HUSAVIK

Husavik is often called the "Whale watching capital" of Iceland. The town's offshore waters are home to 15 different whale species, as well as dolphins and 30 variety of bird. Watching these graceful ocean giants in their Arctic habitat is an unforgettable experience.





DAY 7 | SEYDISFJORDUR

Iceland's East Fjords are best explored from the impossibly picturesque port of Seydisfjordur, nestled between the sea and steep mountains. Activities include seal spotting, horseback riding and visiting the beautiful Skalanes nature reserve.

DAY 8 | DJUPIVOGUR

The fishing village of Djupivogur is today's starting point to explore Vatnajokull Glacier (optional). Go on a four wheel-drive Jeep tour (optional) or take a boat trip in the Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon (optional). Icebergs of all shapes and sizes are floating in the water – an unforgettable adventure.

DAY 9 | VESTMANNAEYJAR (WESTMAN ISLANDS)

Located off Iceland's South Coast, the Westman Islands were formed by submarine volcanic eruptions around 10,000 years ago. We go ashore on Heimaey, the only inhabited island, where half-buried houses remain from a violent 1973 eruption.

DAY 10 | REYKJAVIK

After breakfast we bid farewell to the OCEAN DIAMOND as we sail back into Reykjavik. Explore inland areas like the Golden Circle and its famous Gullfoss waterfall or other post-cruise programs. 

Enjoy a first glimpse of our 2022 shore excursions! You can look forward to many different excursion options that provide a hands-on experience with nature and a deeper look into Icelandic life.

Stykkisholmur

GLACIER TOUR ON THE SNAEFELLSJOKULL GLACIER

Tour Highlights: Glacier tour in an open snowcat Difficulty level: Depending on the ice and snow conditions, the glacier walk might be on uneven, soft or steep ground

Remarks: Open vehicle; warm clothes (gloves, hat, etc.) required; sunglasses; not suitable for guests who have difficulty walking or need an assitive device

Duration: 4-5 hours

This 4,600 feet high glacier is one of the most beautiful volcanos of the island. An experienced guide will drive you by snowcat up the glacier. In good weather conditions you can enjoy a fantastic view over Hellissandur and Breidafjordur Bay and on especially clear days you might even spot the far-off Westfjords. The famous novelist Jules Verne once chose Snaefellsjokull Glacier to be the entrance "to the center of the Earth".



BUS EXCURSION AROUND THE SNAEFELLSNES PENINSULA

Tour Highlights: An introduction to the history and geology of Iceland, diverse landscapes and a visit to the shark museum

Difficulty level: This tour involves walking (approx. 45 min) on rugged terrain, but it's also possible to stay on the coach

Duration: 5-6 hours

Due to its diversity of landscapes and places of national interest, the Snaefellsnes Peninsula is often called "Iceland in miniature". This excursion includes a drive through beautiful scenery, lava fields, black sand beaches and impressive glaciers. You will have a stunning view of Snaefellsjokull Glacier, and the dramatic rock formations of Snaefellsnes as well as the Londrangar rock pinnacles, which are remnants of a large volcanic crater. In the summer months (mid-April to mid-August) a huge variety of birds can be seen. En route you also visit the small fishing village of Arnarstapi and the Shark Museum in Bjarnarhofn.



BOAT TOUR & SEAFOOD TASTING

Tour Highlights: Fascinating bird life, breathtaking scenery and seafood tasting

- **Difficulty level:** Suitable for all guests; short 10 minute walk to the pier
- Remarks: Warm, weatherproof jacket and sunglasses; excursion boat with indoor and outdoor seats Duration: Approx. 2.5 hours

If you have never tasted a fresh scallop straight from the sea you'll get the chance to do so on this tour. Experience the traditional Icelandic trapping method of mussels, scallops, shrimps or sea star and afterwards enjoy a delicious tasting of this "Viking-style sushi". Look forward to cruising past picturesque and fairytale-like landscapes in the Breidafjordur Bay as well as a huge variety of birds (mid April to mid August) and terrific basaltic rock formations. With a bit of luck you can spot a majestic white-tailed eagle.





BUS TOUR – DYNJANDI WATERFALL

Tour Highlights: Drive through rugged landscapes to the magnificent Dynjandi waterfall Difficulty level: 20 minutes moderate walking on uneven ground to the waterfall; the waterfall can also be seen very clearly from the parking lot Remarks: Clothes according to local weather; lunch included

Duration: 5-6 hours

Discover the beauty of Iceland's mystic Westfjords, which is a very sparsely populated area even for Iceland. Experience breathtaking wilderness, high summits and beautiful, deep fjords. Along the way you will visit a typical Icelandic village, where you will also have lunch. Another highlight of this tour is the magnificent Dynjandi, the highest and most impressive waterfall in the Westfjord region. It consists of six different cascades that flow into a large fanshaped waterfall and its impressive height of 328 feet and width of 196 feet make it a spectacular natural beauty.



Siglufjordur HERRING INTOXICATION

Tour Highlights: The history and the key role of the Icelandic herring industry. A traditional musical performance, herring and "Brennivin" tasting, and entrance to the Herring Museum are included. Difficulty level: Easy walking for 15 min to the

museum Remarks: Clothes according to local weather

Duration: Approx. 2 hours

Dive into the golden age of the herring boom at the award-winning Herring Museum. The era played an important role in the history of the Icelandic equal rights movement because women got more opportunities to work outside of the home, side by side with men on an equal basis. The museum's five exhibits illustrate the history of the industry. the processing of the herring into meal and oil, a fish freezing plant and a waterfront dock area where visitors can stroll past 11 different fishing vessels on display. A live herring salting demonstration - with traditional songs and dances performed by the local "Herring Girls" - brings the spirit of old herring plants to life.




Husavik **BUS TOUR - MYVATN MAJOR**

Tour Highlights: The Lake Myvatn, Godafoss Waterfall, Dimmuborgir, Myvatn Nature Baths

Difficulty level: Easy walking, longest walking time 20 min

Remarks: Clothes according to local weather; bring a bathing suit and a towel (provided by ship); entrance fee to Nature Baths included; lockers at Nature Baths available; lunch included Duration: 7-8 hours

Enjoy one of the most beautiful areas of Northern Iceland. The local unique landscape would be fascinating on its own. However, in the area around Lake Myvatn there are also countless bird species (mid April to mid August). We also stop at the impressive black lava formations of Dimmuborgir and visit the spectacular Godafoss waterfall (waterfall of the gods). In the end, a soothing bath awaits you at Myvatn Nature Baths. The thermal bath offers you a unique composition of minerals, silicates and geothermal microorganisms. The warm, soothing water is a treat for body and mind and leaves a lasting effect after this visit. Look forward to an amazing journey through an area of extreme contrasts.



BUS TOUR – ICELANDIC NATURE AND CULTURE

Tour Highlights: Godafoss Waterfall and Eyjafjord as well as Icelandic culture and history Difficulty level: Easy walking, longest walking time 20 min

Remarks: Clothes according to local weather; entrance to Laufas Farm included

Duration: Approx. 4 hours

This half-day excursion combines scenic highlights like the Eviafjord, Vikurskard mountain pass and Godafoss — one of the most spectacular waterfalls in Iceland- with extensive Icelandic history and culture. The well-preserved Laufas Farm (founded in 1850) is nowadays a museum that reflects rural living conditions during former times. Built with strips of sod and turf, the farmhouse was home to the local priest and his attendants. It was one of the richest farms in the area.

They are world known for their basalt columns that characterize the ancient lava flow. You also stop at the Dettifoss Waterfall, Europe's most unique and powerful waterfall and also where a mass of water, mud and sand rumbles into Iceland's most impressive canyon.



This two hour horseback tour offers a wonderful way to appreciate the beauty of the coast and nearby mountains. You will also have endless opportunities for spotting birds and seals and enjoy the wonderful nature.

Sail among the huge icebergs in the picturesque scenery of Jokulsarlon with a specially equipped boat for approximately 35 minutes.





At the end of the hike, we visit a unique volcano museum that tells the story of the Heimaey volcanic eruption in 1973, the emergence of Surtsev Island in 1963, and the geology of the Westman Islands.

Immerse yourself completely in this unique world!

The world's largest island is strikingly beautiful, a land of massive ice formations, deep-blue fjords and lush pastures. Greenland is also blessed with unique flora and fauna, the midnight sun and northern lights, and the distinctive Inuit culture.



GREENLAND



Uummannaq

Located 300 miles (500 km) north of the Arctic Circle, Uummannaq is one of the most beautiful towns in Greenland. The town takes its unusual name – Uummannaq means "heart shaped" in Greenlandic – from a massive mountain (3,839 feet/1,175 meters) that towers above the island. An interesting local museum features an exhibition of German climatologist and geophysicist Alfred Wegener's 18thcentury polar exploration.

Nuuk

Greenland's capital has around 16,000 inhabitants and combines Inuit traditions with modern European urbanity. It's also Greenland's oldest town, founded in 1728 by the Danish Norwegian missionary Hans Egede. The National Museum features 500-year-old mummies from Qilakitsoq, as well as other artifacts related to Greenland archaeology, history and art. The Katuaq Cultural Center in downtown Nuuk is the venue for concerts, exhibitions, cinema and local cuisine. The University of Greenland, the country's only university, is also located in Nuuk.

Sisimiut

Sisimiut has a turbulent history, especially during the 18th century when the first Danish colony was destroyed by Dutch whalers who wanted to establish their own settlement. The Danes fought back and eventually recaptured Sisimiut after several fierce battles in the 1730s. Because of its flourishing shrimp industry, Sisimiut is one of Greenland's most prosperous cities today.



Qaqortoq

With 3,000 inhabitants, Qaqortoq is the largest settlement in South Greenland. In this charming town you can find lots of strikingly beautiful colonial buildings, dating from the establishment of the town in 1775. The area has a rich history, as it has been inhabited continuously since prehistoric times. You can still see traces of Thule and Norse cultures throughout the region.



NCE CHRISTIAN SOUND

Prince Christian Sound

The force of Greenland's massive inland icecap pushes glaciers towards the sea, where large chunks of ice break off and become floating icebergs. When we cruise the 70-mile (100-km) Prince Christian Sound – which separates the Cape Farewell islands from the mainland – we get so close to icebergs that you can almost reach out and touch them.

Disko Bay

Disko Bay combines incredible iceberg scenery and Inuit hospitality. Along the eastern edge of the bay is Ilulissat, the third largest town in Greenland. The name means "iceberg" in Greenlandic, a reference to its location at the mouth of the iceberg-filled Ilulissat Ice Fjord, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 2004.

East Greenland

East Greenland is one of the most isolated areas in the world. To the west, the massive central icecap rises 8,000 feet. To the east is the open ocean, strewn with drifting sea ice from the North Pole. This seclusion is the reason why traditions and culture run deeper here than anywhere else in Greenland. Untouched nature with huge fjords and mighty icebergs dominates the landscape.

Skjoldungen Fjord is bordered by towering mountains tipped with snow and ice-scraped valley sides with serpentine rivers of ice plunging into the sea. It's highly likely that the fjord was inhabited by Paleo-Eskimo (Inuit) nomadic people as early as 4,000 years ago. Surrounded by wild and pristine nature, it is quite common to see whales, bearded seals and various kinds of birds in the area. with its floating icebergs.

DAY 5 | DAY AT SEA / PRINCE CHRISTIAN SOUND

When conditions are favorable, we travel along the 70 mile (112 km) long Prince Christian Sound which connects the Labrador and Irminger Seas. In this narrow, often ice choked channel, we come so close to icebergs you can almost reach out and touch one. The force of Greenland's massive inland ice cap pushes glaciers towards the sea, where large chunks of ice break off and become floating icebergs.

DAY 6 | QAQORTOQ

With 3,000 inhabitants, Qaqortoq is the largest settlement in South Greenland. In this charming town you can find lots of strikingly beautiful colonial buildings, dating from the establishment of the town in 1775. The area has a rich history, as it has been inhabited continuously since prehistoric times. You can still see traces of Thule and Norse cultures throughout the region.

DAY 7 | NUUK

With 16,000 inhabitants Nuuk is both the capital and the biggest city of Greenland. It combines Arctic traditions with European urbanity. Visit the city sights on a walking tour that ends at the National Museum which exhibits the famous mummies of Qilakitsoq.

DAY 8 | SISIMIUT

With approx. 5,600 inhabitants, Sisimiut is the second largest town in Greenland. It is a modern settlement that maintains ancient traditions. The fishing industry still plays an important role.

DAY 9 | ILULISSAT

In the morning we reach Ilulissat village in fabled Disko Bay. Ilulissat is located beside the Ilulissat Icefjord. Delight in the thunderous spectacle when icebergs break off from the glacier and plunge into the fjord.

DAY 10 | UUMMANNAQ

Uummannaq is considered one of the most beautiful towns in Greenland. Located on a small island about 300 miles (483 km) north of the Arctic Circle, this tiny, picturesque village lies at the foot of a heart shaped mountain.





DAY 11 | DISKO BAY / OEOERTARSUAO

The small settlement of Qegertarsuag is located on the South Coast of Disko Island. In 1773, the first whaling base was founded there. Whaling has been of great importance to the town over the past two centuries. Hunting and fishing are still the primary occupations for the island's inhabitants.

DAY 12 | KANGERLUSSUAQ

Soft adventure is the emphasis of our shore excursions in Greenland, a combination of ground, water and air journeys that exude a rich understanding of the giant island, its unique peoples and incredible landscapes. Many of the excursions are naturally dependent on weather and ice conditions.

Ilulissat

ICE FJORD CRUISE

Tour Highlights: An unforgettable cruise among the icebergs of the UNESCO World Heritage Ice Fjord Difficulty Level: No walking involved

Remarks: Warm clothing recommended; excursion boat with mostly outdoor space and limited seating; daily ice conditions determine how far the boat can go into the fjord

Duration: Approx. 2 hours

Ilulissat means "icebergs" in Greenlandic and the Ilulissat Ice Fjord is impressive whether viewed from the air or the sea. Experience an unforgettable cruise to the mouth of the Ilulissat Ice Fjord, where an underwater moraine catches many of the large icebergs. The only way to cross the moraine is via pressure from behind – therefore you always see a multitude of huge icebergs directly in front of Ilulissat.

HIKE TO THE ICEBERGS OF SERMERMIUT

Tour Highlights: Learn more about Greenland's Inuit culture on this hike through stunning Arctic nature and see impressive icebergs

Difficulty Level: ATTENTION! This hike covers mountainous terrain in all variations! A demanding – 5 mile – long hike

Remarks: Hiking shoes and outdoor clothing recommended; please bring a bottle of water; lunch boxes; at the beginning and the end of the hike we walk through the town of Ilulissat (30-40 minutes each way)

Duration: 5-6 hours

Hike through spectacular surroundings on the way to "Holms Bakke," which offers great views of Jakobshavn Ice Fjord and its many icebergs. The trail also leads to the Inuit ruins at Sermermiut, where you can



discover the culture and lifestyle of the early lnuit, the first people to settle the area around 2,000 B.C. You can still see the relics reflecting their presence. Hear stories about lnuit life and traditions before the Europeans arrived in Greenland.

Ammassalik Island GLACIER WALK & ICE CAVE TOUR

Tour Highlights: Climb and walk on a glacier, explore an ice cave and participate in a stunning boat ride Difficulty Level: This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility; moderate to difficult hiking Remarks: This tour includes transportation, glacier equipment, snacks, water, coffee, tea; remember to bring hiking boots, warm clothing (layer), camera and water; please note there might be no toilets on this tour

Duration: approx. 4 hours including 1.5 hours of sailing

Nuuk

Nuuk is the capital of Greenland and its oldest town. Founded in 1728 by Danish-Norwegian missionary Hans Egede, the city combines Arctic traditions and European urbanity. With around 16,000 inhabitants, Nuuk is considered a bustling metropolis compared to the rest of Greenland's cities and settlements. This guided tour takes you through the old city center and includes a visit to the National Museum of Greenland which exhibits 500-year-old Inuit-mummies discovered in Qilakitsoq 40 years ago. In the local market, you can find seal, fish and musk ox for sale.

BOTANIC TUNDRA HIKE

Tour Highlights: Stunning landscapes, Blaesedalen "Valley of the Winds" – and waterfalls

Difficulty Level: Moderate 3-mile long hike in mountainous, uneven terrain

Remarks: Hiking shoes and outdoor clothing recommended; please bring a bottle of water

Duration: Approx. 2.5 hours

The Blaesedalen "Valley of the Winds" is located right outside of Qeqertarsuaq. Sometimes, a heavy wind blows through the valley from the nearby Arctic plateau, which is how Blaesedalen received its name. But the valley also impresses with its waterfalls, scenic variety anddiversified flora and fauna. Learn more about tundra vegetation and the adaptions of plants to the Arctic climate on this botanic hike.



Sisimiut INUIT CULTURE & HISTORY HIKE

Tour Highlights: Amazing scenery, Tele Island and and Inuit culture

Difficulty Level: Approx. 2 hours of hiking on uneven terrain

Remarks: Hiking shoes and outdoor clothing recommended; please bring a bottle of water **Duration:** Approx. 2 hours

Do you want to know more about Greenlandic culture? Join this guided hike to the place where it all started 4,000 years ago. Different Inuit cultures used Tele Island a hunting ground over the years. Learn about the way they lived. From the Tele Island you also have a beautiful view over Sisimiut with Nasaasaq Mountain in the background.

UUMMANNAQ MUSEUM AND CHURCH

Tour Highlights: History and culture of Greenland **Difficulty Level:** Approx. 0.3 miles of walking to the museum, partly uphill

Remarks: Entrance to museum and church visit included

Uummannaq Museum tells fascinating stories about the region's human and natural history. Particularly interesting is anexhibit on the extensive polar exploration that took place and Alfred Wegener's expedition on a propeller-driven sled onto the Greenland Ice Cap. Already world famous because he originated the theory of continental drift, Wegener wanted to build a scientific station in the middle of the ice cap. The museum also houses copies of the famous Qilaktisog mummies, which were discovered in this area in 1972. The church next door is the only stone church in Greenland and is also open for guests to visit.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

ALCOHOL

Bringing alcohol aboard is generally not allowed. The only exception is a small "corkage fee" charged to passengers who want to enjoy a special bottle of wine with a meal. A large variety of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks are served on board in the restaurant and bar.

CABIN FEATURES

All cabins are equipped with shower/toilet, television, closet, refrigerator, hairdryer and access to satellite phone. Cabins are cleaned daily and there is turndown service.

CHANGES TO CRUISE ITINERARY & SHORE EXCURSIONS

Due to local weather, sea and ice conditions, all of our cruise itineraries and shore excursions are subject to change. The implementation of our shore excursions also depends on reaching the minimum/ maximum number of participants for each activity. Iceland ProCruises reserves the right to change the itinerary and trip content without prior notice.

CHILDREN

Children must be 8 years or older (10 years or older on Greenland trips). Discounts of 25% on cruises and shore excursions are offered to children up to age 12 staying in their parents' cabin. Please note that we do not offer child-care services or children's play areas on board. Riding our Zodiacs requires a certain level of body control. Due to safety reasons, the captain reserves the right to refuse a landing with children.

CRUISE CARD

At embarkation you will receive a personal Cruise Card which you should always have with you. This card is used on board as a combination payment instrument and identity card. Shore excursions, alcoholic beverages, spa services etc. will be paid with your cruise card. At the end of the voyage you can settle your account by credit card (we accept Visa, MasterCard and American Express) or you can pay with cash (USD).

DIETARY SPECIAL REQUESTS

Please inform us about any special dietary needs (e.g. vegetarian or gluten free, diabetic food) at least two weeks before departure. In order to ensure efficient service, please re-confirm your requirements with the crew after boarding the ship.

DRESS CODE

The dress code on board is casual. Leave your ties, jackets and evening dresses at home. For days at sea and ashore we recommend comfortable, breathable, waterproof and windproof clothing, plus gloves, thermal underwear and sturdy footwear. For the Captain's and Farewell cocktail parties we recommend smart casual dress style.

GRATUITIES

Tipping is a way of showing your appreciation for a service received on board from the hotel staff or Expedition Team. The amount of the gratuity is totally at your discretion. During the voyage we hand out a flyer about the handling of tips. For your convenience, we can charge the suggested gratuity to your onboard account. If you would like to cancel or make adjustments to the gratuity posted on your account, you can do so by visiting the reception desk. Gratuities are divided amongst the hotel crew and Expedition Team.

HEALTH & MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Although we do not have an official requirement regarding personal fitness, you should be able to move on board and ashore without the help of others. At all times there is an English-speaking doctor on board. The ship is equipped with a small clinic and medications to treat certain emergencies.

INSURANCE

Repatriation costs in case of illness can be extremely high. Therefore, we strongly recommend purchasing travel/health insurance prior to your voyage, specifically policies that cover repatriation costs to your home country. This insurance is mandatory for our trips to Greenland. Information on all-inclusive insurance packages — including travel cancellation, curtailment, baggage and medical — can be found on the websites of various providers.

INTERNET & PHONE

Iceland ProCruises offers free WiFi in the public areas of Club Lounge, Observation Lounge and Library during Iceland Cruises. There is no free Wifi in those areas during Greenland Cruises. For an extra charge we offer internet access in your cabin. Mobile-phone reception should be possible in most regions along our route. For further details please contact your mobile phone operator. A telephone deposit for external phone calls as well as an internet deposit for your laptop or tablet can be purchased at the reception. Please ensure that your 'Data Roaming' feature is switched off.

LANGUAGE ONBOARD

English is the official language on board. Therefore all members of our Expedition Team and the reception staff speak English (as well as German). Onboard announcements are made in English and German. The daily program as well as the dining room menu are also bilingual (English and German). If you require translation, our multi-lingual Expedition Team is always at your disposal.

LAUNDRY

Professional laundry service is available for an additional charge.

PASSPORTS & VISAS

Each passenger is responsible for ensuring that he/ she meets the applicable passport and visa requirements for the duration of the trip. The passport is the only valid proof of identity for all trips. An ID card is not sufficient. The passport must be valid for at least 6 months after your trip ends. Please note that each participant is responsible for obtaining all necessary documents. Costs incurred due to insufficient travel documents must be paid by the passenger.

PHYSICAL DISABILITIES & ACCESSIBILITY

Guests with physical disabilities are recommended to travel with an accompanying person. The particular processes on board should be handled without external help. The gangway can be – depending on the individual disability – a challenge. The angle of inclination of the gangway varies due to tide and different circumstances in the respective port. Please note that the guest's participation in shore excursions as well as the (dis-)embarkation by zodiac can be denied by the master or Cruise Leader due to security reasons. The instructions of the master must be followed. The ship is not suitable for wheelchairs. A medical certificate must be submitted on request by Iceland ProCruises.

RESTAURANT/DINING

Breakfast, lunch and dinner are included in your cruise price. Breakfast and lunch are buffet style; dinner is a la carte. Coffee, tea and water are free during the entire voyage; other drinks can be purchased in the restaurant or bar. If you're not on board at lunch time, we prepare a lunch box for you to take ashore. In the afternoon we offer tea and coffee in the lounge on Deck 4, which is also the venue for our late-night snack.

SAFETY

The ship complies with all safety requirements and is certified for travel in Arctic waters. Before departure, all passengers receive instructions in onboard safety procedures and operations including the location of lifejackets in your cabin. Familiarize yourself with the ship's evacuation plan. Special safety procedures apply to trips in the Zodiacs.

SMOKING

For safety reasons and to protect the health of our guests and employees, smoking is permitted only in the designated smoking area on the outside deck. Do not throw your cigarette butts overboard but use the ashtray. Smoking is strictly prohibited in all cabins, on balconies and in all other locations on the ship.

DIETARY SPECIAL REQUESTS

Please inform us about any special dietary needs (e.g. vegetarian or gluten free, diabetic food) at least two weeks before departure. In order to ensure efficient service, please re-confirm your requirements with the crew after boarding the ship.

VACCINATIONS

Ask your local health authorities about recommended vaccinations.

VOLTAGE

All cabins are equipped with 220 volt outlets (Europlug socket).

WATER

All water from onboard taps and water stations is chlorinated. The water in the water stations is also extra filtered. Sometimes the water from the water taps or in bathrooms may have a brownish color. This is quite common on ships and is due to oxygen in the water touching the iron piping. If you let the water flow for few seconds, it will be clear. The tap water onboard is not safe to drink, but you can use it for brushing your teeth. There are three different water stations around the ship where you can refill your water bottles: The Club Lounge on Deck 4, the Main Lounge on Deck 5 and the Observation Lounge on Deck 7.

ZODIAC LANDINGS

Many of our landings and excursions are carried out with motorized "Zodiac" brand rubber boats. These boats feature a low draught and great stability. Life vests are mandatory when riding in the Zodiacs. Landings generally depend on local circumstances. In each case, the master makes the final decision if the landing is possible or not. Particular safety regulations apply on landings. All guests receive mandatory instruction in the security guidelines.


Day Excursions

Why not stay a little longer? Our pre- or post-cruise programs perfectly complement your voyage on one of our ships. Whether it's a self-drive car trip, additional hotel nights or a helicopter tour to one of the largest waterfalls in Iceland, you design your ultimate Iceland adventure.

SOUTH COAST ADVENTURE

On this comfortable coach tour, we travel along Iceland's scenic south shore to Vik, a village flanked by high cliffs and black sand beaches. Along the way we stop at Skogafoss and Seljalandsfoss waterfalls, and Skogar Folk museum to see how Icelanders lived in past centuries. All day long there are stunning views of glaciers, coastlines and impressive rock formations.

Duration: Approx. 10 hrs



GOLDEN CIRCLE

This eclectic journey takes visitors to the world famous Geysir area with its active geysers, and Gullfoss waterfall, which plunges 230 feet (70 meters) in three stages into a narrow rock chasm. The journey continues into Thingvellir National Park, where Iceland's ancient parliament convened, and the hot spring of Nesjavellir. On the way back to the capital, we briefly stop at the former bishopric of Skalholt and visit the greenhouses of Fridheimar. Duration: Approx. 8 hours

SILVER CIRCLE HELICOPTER TOUR

Taking off from Reykjavik, the helicopter glides above Hvalfjordur Fjord and impressive Glymur waterfall, which cascades 640 feet (195 meters) down a volcanic cliff. We then fly into Thingvellir National Park (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) to get a bird's-eye-view of the rift valley that separates the North American and Eurasian tectonic plates. Finally we soar over Mt. Hengill volcano and its active geothermal field of steamy wonders and nearby geothermal power plant. Duration: Approx. 1.5 hrs

SUPER-JEEP SAFARI THORSMORK

With its varied vegetation and spectacular topography, Thorsmork is a paradise for hikers and nature enthusiasts. Located near the south coast, the valley is surrounded by three glaciers including the famous Eyjafjallajokull. To reach this remote area we need to cross countless rivers of various sizes in our Super-Jeep vehicle - a bonus for off-road fans! Other stops along the way include Gigjokull glacial lagoon, the Seljalandsfoss waterfall and the active volcanic area around Hengill. Good footwear is a prerequisite.

LAND AND ITS PEOPLE

Iceland fascinates with diversity. There aren't many places on Earth where you can find black-sand beaches, erupting volcanoes, lumbering glaciers and thunderous waterfalls on the same day as swimming in hot springs, betting on when geysers will erupt, and hiking across barren rocky deserts or regions with an incrediblediversity of moss, lichen and shrubs. The inhabited coastal regions form the smallest part of the island. Meanwhile, 11% of Iceland's surface is covered by glaciers while 60% of the whole country is dominated by uninhabited highlands or deserts. These desolate regions can only be traversed by four-wheel-drive vehicles during the summer. The volcanic island truly offers lots of space for its inhabitants and visitors. Around 330,000 people live on the island's 103,000 km² (64,001 miles²) but two thirds of them reside in the Reykjavik area, located in the southwest. The Reykjanes Peninsula is home to Keflavik International Airport, about 45 km (28 miles) from the capital. Iceland is also famous for its hospitality, which visitors can experience throughout the country.

CLIMATE

Although the warm Gulf Stream has a positive effect on the climate, visitor must be ready for all kinds of weather. In summer temperatures vary around 12° -15° C/53–59° F, although they may rise to 20°C / 68° F. Rain showers are always possible, even if they don't last long. Temperatures in winter hover around +/-5°C / 23–41° F; even though it can be very windy, it's not as cold as generally assumed.

CURRENCY

The local currency is the Icelandic Krone ("krona" or ISK). The homepage of the Icelandic National Bank (www.cb.is) posts information about current exchange rates. All major credit cards – like Master Card, Visa, JCB, Diners and American Express – are widely accepted.

Important: Most shops, restaurants and especially gas stations also request the PIN number of the credit card, to complete the payment.

ATMs for cash withdrawals are available in larger towns and airports.

LANGUAGE

The official language is Icelandic. The roots of this old language go back to the era of Norwegian Vikings. English and Danish are nowadays very common as well.

TIME DIFFERENCE

Icelandic clocks are set to GMT (Greenwich Mean Time).

LAND AND ITS PEOPLE

Greenland, an autonomous country within the Kingdom of Denmark, is home to around 56,000 people and has an impressive surface area of 2,166,086 km² (1,345,943 miles²). While the northern corner of the island is located only 730 km (453 miles) south of the North Pole, the south of Greenland lies on the same latitude as Oslo. With several climate zones Greenland offers both a diversity of scenery and a variety of wildlife. Majestic whales, musk oxen and sea eagles are some animal species which inhabit the huge island. During the summer, visitors encounter blankets of wildflowers which form a vibrant contrast to the icebergs floating in nearby fjords and the massive inland ice cap. Over 1,000 years ago, Erik the Red decided to settle here and gave the unknown country its name. Today, many ruins recall the history of those early Norse settlers. Disko Bay on the west coast is dominated by impressive icebergs in various shapes, sizes and colors. This ever-changing display is a result of large pieces of ice "calving" (breaking off) from the outer edge of Sermeg Kualleg Glacier and floating through the Ilulissat Ice Fjord into the bay. The rich waters of Disko Bay also attract an array of whales, seabirds and other wildlife. Nuuk with 16,000 inhabitants is the biggest city in Greenland.

CLIMATE

Greenland has an Arctic climate, which means you should be prepared for sunny days, but also for cold, fresh mornings and evenings. The average temperature reaches a maximum of $+10^{\circ}C/50^{\circ}F$ during the summer months.

Nevertheless, you might experience days with temperatures of $+15-20^{\circ}C/59-68^{\circ}F$. Therefore, it's important to bring warm as well as light clothes so you can layer.

CURRENCY

As an autonomous country within the Kingdom of Denmark, Greenland and uses the Danish Kroner (DKK) as its currency. We strongly advise that you exchange money before arriving in Greenland. Most hotels and many shops accept all major credit cards. But in several places, cash will be more useful as ATMs are only available in larger towns.

LANGUAGE

Kalaallisut (West Greenlandic) is the sole official language. Danish is still widely used in administration and higher education, as well as remaining the first or only language for some people in Nuuk and larger towns. The majority of Greenlanders speak both Kalaallisut and Danish. Although schools in larger communities generally teach English, inhabitants of small communities usually don't speak English.

TIME DIFFERENCE

In summer, southwest Greenland is two hours behind GMT (Greenwich Mean Time).
